Scholarship applications for 2025 went live on December 1! To better accommodate students, the application opening date has moved a month earlier, to provide time for students to work on their application during the Christmas break. The deadline for submitting an application is February 1.

WFACF is home to over 60 scholarship funds. Many funds award multiple scholarships annually and/or multi-year awards. In 2024, over \$600,000 was awarded. In 2025, over 140 scholarships are expected to be awarded!

#### TIME FOR COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP - OPEN DEC. 2 - DEC 31!

The application window for WFACF's annual Community Partnership Grant Cycle has closed, and we received requests from over 50 local organizations for funding they need that is essential to their plans to better our local communities. The grant cycle is funded by WFACF's Fund for the Wichita Falls Area, an endowment that limits our granting amount to the spending rate for the current year.

#### **TEXOMA GIVES - IT'S A WRAP!**
